Director's Letter

September 2021

Greetings!

Thank you for paddling into the headwinds with us this past year. Headwinds are tough on the mind as well as on the body, and this year we have all faced many different types of headwinds - social, financial, and individual. Even as we worry about the environmental and political climate, we have found strength in this community, and in our other circles of life. There is strength when we paddle together.

Red Canoe Foundation knew the year was going to be challenging, but we also knew more than ever that we need to continue to have sufficient funds to support young people's wilderness transformations. And so, in October 2020, we set a "stretch" fundraising goal of \$100,000 knowing the hard work that lay ahead to achieve it. Once again you, our faithful supporters, dug in with us and together we raised \$105,608!

As we worked to raise the funds, RCF's Scholarship Review Workgroup reviewed and assessed eleven requests for financial support. By the spring, we had made financial commitments totaling \$41,635 to support eleven campers at Wabun, and an additional \$12,990 to support campers from Bear Island – Wabun's neighbors one mile to the south where the Teme-Augama Anishnabai First Nations people have lived for centuries. Shortly thereafter, we learned that the camp made the difficult and necessary decision not to operate for a second year in a row, a disappointment for them as well as many prospective campers. Happily, two campers to whom we had pledged support found alternate summer wilderness experiences that we funded. We were also able to support programs through Chicago Voyagers for a second year; they notified us that Red Canoe Foundation's \$6,000 grant supported 60 young people who participated in a variety of canoe trips over the course of the summer.



Red Canoe Foundation consistently enjoys tailwinds in its efforts to recruit new Board members who help the organization grow and strengthen! In the spring, Hardin Coleman joined the Board, and Phoebe Knowles and Jason Lewis returned. Phoebe took on the role of Board Chair, and Maddy Vertenten began her term as Vice Chair. Ben Simmons transitioned from the Board to a staff position as Assistant Executive Director. Finally, Katie Stauffer joined Louise Moses as co-Chair of the Marketing and Communications Committee. I cannot imagine working with a more committed group of volunteers who freely give of their time and talents! There is a lot of work to accomplish, and the Red Canoe Foundation team knows how to get it done!

Thank you for another fantastic year of managing the headwinds. There is no question that the coming year will be full of white water as well as lake paddling but as long as we are Paddling Together, we'll still make wonderful progress!

Chair's Letter

RCF 2021

Dear Red Canoe Foundation Family,

Would you take a minute with me to pause, wherever you are reading this, and recall a moment when you were in the natural world, beholding something gorgeous – perhaps a sunset, a sunrise, a pristine shoreline, a path in the woods in solitude. Recall the sense that you've happened upon something extraordinary and carry it forward with you as you read this letter.

This last year I have watched my own children adapt to the COVID realities of constant Zoom meetings and the siren call of social online games like Roblox. I have read articles about increased levels of teen depression and a loneliness epidemic caused in large part by smart phones and social media as proxy for real human social connection. I have listened to activists like Kenji Haroutunian discuss the importance of equity and inclusion in wilderness programming and outdoor recreation.



I know in my bones that Red Canoe Foundation's mission of helping young people get access to meaningful wilderness experiences is more critical than ever. This is one of the reasons I am thrilled to be back and serving as Chair of the Board as we journey together to bring our mission into reality.

I previously served on the Board of RCF's earlier iteration, Friends of Wabun. Recently, I found my notes for a letter I was writing to the FOW community – similar to this one. It was the year we had awarded our very first two camper scholarships. I wrote:

"I think about what awaits those kids - what discoveries they will have, what memories they will make, what stories they will tell. And if I could prepare them in some small way for the journey, what would I say? What stories would I tell? Initially I would give pragmatic advice like, 'send letters early and often so that you receive letters over the course of the summer.' I know exchanging handwritten letters is a lost art in this screen-age – but it is an indescribably great feeling to receive mail at camp. I would tell them to be patient with themselves during the first few days as friendships develop and calluses form. Everyone goes through a little bit of a metamorphosis at the beginning. And then, with deep nostalgia for my own summers at camp, I would ask them to breathe deeply, internalize and hold on to the smells, sit quietly and memorize things like the sunlight on the water and the rain drops pearling up off of the lake during a downpour..."

We have given many more scholarships since that first year, and I want to ask the same questions every time. "How will this young person's life be impacted by this experience? What will they take away?"

As I reflect on the past year, I am so thankful for each and every one of you, our Red Canoe Foundation family of supporters, and for the opportunity to serve with this board of passionate and committed people. Together we will continue to make extraordinary wilderness experiences available to more young people. Here's to moving onward and upward together!

Spotlight on Camper Fundraisers



Vivienne Pope, a 9th grader and Wabun camper, received RCF's letter asking campers to consider making a donation. Seamus Monahan, a Wabun camper who was in Wabun C during the summer of 2019, knows the privilege it is to attend a camp like Wabun. He took his camp energy and reached out to family and friends, asking them to make a donation of any size to RCF. By this simple act, he raised more than the full summer tuition so that another young person with limited means could receive a scholarship.



The Wanna B's

Seamus found another way to stay connected to Wabun and the wilderness despite the limitations imposed by Covid. With the encouragement of their parents, Seamus and four other fellow campers from Wabun C completed a ten-day trip down the Allegheny River in Pennsylvania during the summer of 2020. It was led by three older boys, two of whom had been trip staff at Wabun and another who had just completed his second Bay Trip. When asked about the differences between this trip and Wabun, Seamus

reflected, "we had to use plastic canoes and didn't have a wanigan for everyone. The trip was also easier than a normal Wabun trip, and we saw people and houses most days." Because most of the boys would have been in Wabun B that summer, they dubbed themselves the "Wanna B's." Seamus and the others hope to return to Wabun during the summer of 2022.

Financial Summary FY2021




Between July 1, 2020, and June 30, 2021 (our fiscal year), the theme for the Annual Giving Campaign was Headwinds. Our fundraising goal for FY2021 was \$100,000, which we were able to achieve with the generous support of our donors. One reason for this which is not highlighted below was our record number of first-time donors; there were 79 in FY2021, up from 63 in FY2020.









Donors By Household (FY 2016-2021)


